



Kluane Lake Research Station – 2025 Spring Summary


The Kluane Lake Research Station's (KLRS) station manager was honoured to join community events throughout the winter, including KFN's Zana Ka Nanááje, community meals and gatherings, and CAFN's Muskrat Camp. KLRS assisted with education outreach, including science activities at the CAFN Youth Centre and St. Elias Community School. Trent University stayed at KLRS in early April to assist Yukon Government with their Community Ecological Monitoring Program. Full operations at KLRS are planned to start at the beginning of May. To kick off the 2025 season, KLRS will host a community BBQ on May 10th at 12-4 pm. Everyone is welcome!

We are looking forward to another busy season at KLRS. Primary and secondary schools from Destruction Bay, Haines Junction, Whitehorse, Calgary, and Mississauga will be visiting the station. Field trips and courses will be held by University of Calgary, Carleton University, Université du Québec and Exeter University. The Howl Experience will return to KLRS with high schools, youth groups, and teacher professional development courses. Two separate artists will be hosted at the station for the Kluane National Park Artist in Residency, in partnership with Park's Canada and Yukon Arts Centre. Yukon Government and Yukon Youth Conservation Corps (Y2C2) will be basing at KLRS for part of their Community Ecological Monitoring Program. The Dän Keyi Renewable Resources Council (DKRRC) will be hosting the Yukon-wide RRC meeting at the station.

Researchers will be visiting KLRS from Yukon University, University of Calgary, Simon Fraser University, University of Ottawa, University of Waterloo, Cardiff University, Queens University, Trent University, Université de Montréal, ÉTS Montréal, McGill University, Ohio State University, and University of Maine. Research topics include glaciology (glacier dynamics and hydro-glaciology), biology (boreal forest ecology), geology (earthquake-induced landslides), geography (subarctic phenology), and agriculture (hydroponics). The hydroponic unit at KLRS will be running this summer; plants will be served at the station and provided to local communities.

REGARDING THE CASTLE ROCK LTF LOCATION AT THE MACKINTOSH GRAVEL PIT

We, in the Nygren Subdivision, question why this Contaminated Land Treatment Facility (LTF) has been supported by CAFN and the Liberal Government to operate in the Mackintosh Gravel Pit.

The response from CAFN to YESAB regarding a Residential Land Application (Project #2008-0181) dated November 5, 2008 stated that CAFN "opposed the application in order to minimize socio-economic and environment effects on the landscape." CAFN wrote "This area is known for its wildlife movement between the two mountain ranges from Bear Creek to Kluane Lake." CAFN further wrote "This area is known for its wild life movement corridor (Alsek River/Decoeli and Archibald Range to Ruby Range corridor) and are **very concerned** about interruption to wildlife in this area." CAFN added that they "recognized this value by declaring the application site as a High Wildlife Value area." CAFN also wrote that "RTC#265 (Trapping) will be impacted by this development."

**However, in the Castle Rock LTF proposal of 2024, CAFN had no concerns or objections about multiple dump trucks hauling 15,000 cubic meters of toxic waste to the same area.

In the YESAB Assessment Report dated January 23, 2025, Section 3.1.7 it states that "the project location was selected based on ... a variety of factors, including: Traffic Increase, Haul time and fuel consumption, distance to the Parks Canada Farm site, and **ECONOMIC VIABILITY.**

The Proponent (Castle Rock) indicated that "the Decoeli old gravel pit would not be a suitable site as it is too far, overlaps with a grizzly bear corridor and the area is known for moose harvesting."

This is the same argument that CAFN used to **DENY the Residential Application of 2008 in the same area. Yet, for all the noise, traffic, environmental and wildlife factors, and toxic waste movement noted, CAFN approves this LTF Project in 2025 which means they are only considering the ECONOMIC VIABILITY for this site. It's all about the money! No concerns for the socio-economic and environment effects on the landscape for this Project!!

The YTG Decision Document (Project #2024-0055) of March 14, 2025 states "The LTF will accept, store, and treat both HIGHLY CONTAMINATED and non-highly contaminated petroleum hydrocarbon impacted soil and water." The YESAB RECOMMENDATION to YTG was that the LTF Project "be allowed to proceed", but also wrote that "the Project will have SIGNIFICANT ADVERSE ENVIRONMENT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC EFFECTS in or outside Yukon that can be mitigated by those terms and conditions." The Rationale for the Decision by YESAB stated "The YTG Decision Body is of the opinion that the YESAB Designated Office identified an appropriate scope of assessment within which to evaluate the impacts of the project, and that the Evaluation Report satisfactorily detailed the environment and social-economic impacts of the project... which the views and information submitted by affected First Nations and other participants were considered.

**These exact words were used by CAFN to DENY Project 2008-0181. Absolute hypocrisy!!

The YTG Decision Body agrees with the YESAB Designated Office findings that the Project is likely to result in SIGNIFICANT ADVERSE EFFECTS TO ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND OTHER LAND USERS, and that these effects can be mitigated by terms and conditions."

**YTG is 100% relying on mitigation to protect our land, water, and wildlife resources. Mitigation efforts fail. The Titanic was 100% unsinkable! Remember Victoria Gold?!

GOVERNMENT RESPONSES TO OUR QUESTIONS ABOUT THEIR SUPPORT OF THIS CONTAMINATED LAND TREATMENT FACILITY IN THE IN THE MACKINTOSH GRAVEL PIT.

We, Nygren Residents, asked our MLA, Wade Istchenko many questions about this LTF placement in our neighbourhood. In turn, Wade asked the Minister of Environment, Nils Clark. The questions and answers can be found in the YTG HANSARD. Here are some of the highlights....

Wade asked, "has any government funding gone into this project and if so how much?" Mr. Clark replied, "The information I have this afternoon is that there has been no funding from the Yukon Government for this project.

**So the Federal Liberal Government is funding it!

When Wade asked "How often will the actual facility itself be inspected?", Mr Clark replied, "With respect to the inspecting, the Proponent (Castle Rock) must inspect their own facility biweekly".

**Isn't that convenient to only inspect yourself, and only twice a month! At least, that is what they are "supposed to do", but nobody is checking on them!

Mr Clark further noted that "Inspectors from the Environment Department ONLY inspect sites based on a risk-informed approach to all activities."

**So Who will advise the Inspectors of a risk if the Proponent (Castle Rock) is the only one inspecting their own site???? Not likely the Proponent (Castle Rock) because it could cause them to halt their operation.

MORE QUESTIONS FORTHCOMING.....

The LTF PROJECT is to ONLY TREAT HYDROCARBONS – NOTHING ELSE. We want to know how and by who is the land tested BEFORE it is all dug up and trucked to the Mackintosh Gravel Pit for treatment.

Why not do the remediation IN PLACE, rather than digging up the unknown contaminants and transporting to the LTF?

Government's Mosquito Control Program.


As such, granular larvicide will be applied to standing water in the Haines Junction area both by air and by hand.

Don't let your dog loose.


