A few highlights from the season so far include:


Skate-A-Thon: Held November 13th.



Several dedicated community members are again volunteering to groom and set ski trails in Kluane National Park this winter. Please avoid driving, walking, biking, or snowshoeing over the ski tracks, if possible. In most cases the ski trails are being set on one side of the groomed road/trail, and there should still be enough room to bike, walk, or snowshoe without damaging the set trails.


Ski trails are being set:

- Along the Mush Lake Road (from Dezadeash Lake Lodge to Alder Creek),
- Around Kathleen Lake (Campground, Day Use Area, and on a portion of the Kings Throne/Cottonwood Trail), and
- On the Auriol Trail.

Please remember that ATVs are prohibited in the Park and snowmobiles are restricted to the ice surface of Kathleen Lake and the access road between the Highway and the Day Use Area.

These restrictions do not apply to CAFN People exercising subsistence harvesting rights. Please contact Park Wardens if you see any illegal activity in the Park: 1 (877) 852-3100.




Kluane Lake Research Station - 2024 Season Summary

The Kluane Lake Research Station (KLRS) wrapped up the 2024 summer season at the end of September. Thank you to all the visitors and staff for a great 5 months! Guests included researchers, students, teachers, government scientists and officials, artists, and community members. The station hosted 1535 overnight users and 130 daytrip users, facilitating over 450 different guests from 46 groups. Additionally, approximately 150 community members visited KLRS during our Community BBQ in May, Open House in August, and weekly community nights throughout the summer. The KLRS staff team consisted of three full-time staff and three part-time staff, five of which were local Yukoners.

Outreach and education were prioritized in 2024. Weekly community nights included talks from researchers and local Indigenous artists, interpreters, scholars, and storytellers. The station welcomed primary and secondary schools from the Yukon (Haines Junction, Destruction Bay, Whitehorse) and Calgary. Yukon University, CAFN Youth Centre, and BGC Yukon brought youth campers to KLRS. The Station Manager and visiting researchers led presentations and hands-on activities to teach students about natural sciences. Two artists were hosted at KLRS for the Kluane National Park Artist Residency, in partnership with Parks Canada and the Yukon Arts Centre. Each artist had a two-week residency and held multiple public art workshops.

Groups from thirteen Canadian universities and ten international universities visited KLRS in 2024 for research, field courses and/or tours. Throughout May to September, long-term studies were continued, and new research was conducted. Topics included glacier dynamics, hydro-glaciology, virtual geology, wind erosion, dust emissions, earthquake-induced landslides, boreal forest ecology, subarctic phenology, vegetation mapping, insect herbivory, and community climate priorities.



Proposed Land Treatment Facility in the MacIntosh Quarry

CastleRock, a Dakwakada Capital Investments company is proposing a new Land
Treatment Facility near Haines Junction at the MacIntosh Quarry which is near Bear
Creek. The LTF will feature several large cells to passively remediate petroleum
hydrocarbons in soil, a process that will typically takes 2 – 18 months depending on the



contamination. Each cell will be lined with a geo-synthetic liner. The LTF will be about $150 \, \text{m} \times 150 \, \text{m}$ and about $850 \, \text{m}$ away from the nearest residence.


