



A Squirrel Workshop

All morning I struggle to write. I wander around the house, I make coffee, I make phone calls. I paw through my horde of ideas filed in a can that once held five pounds of Ripensa of Denmark Butter Cookies (and wish it were full of cookies instead). Where is this elusive piece I am supposed to write? What is this piece I am destined to create? Everything I conjure up is too big, too obscure for me to even contemplate, let alone write.

This afternoon from my studio window, where I am again trying to write, I catch sight of a squirrel quarrelling with a white rag out near the woodpile at the edge of our forest. Cranky wind and cloud portend winter; the Mercury reaches only plus four Celsius today. Frost has been crawling into the earth, and thin ice layers the sleepy creek beside my house. Pale sun and shadow flicker through the scene. It is October, nesting time for Yukon squirrels.

As I watch, I wonder what a squirrel could be planning to do with a large white rag in her nest. The rag seems partially trapped beneath a spruce log, snagged on dry twigs. The determined squirrel grasps the rag with her teeth, yanks, squirms, jerks, tumbles, and then summersaults backwards off the log. The rag is stretchy, obviously someone's abandoned T-shirt. The squirrel's tail flicks like a feather duster. She rests.

But she seems so tenacious. She starts again, squirming around in the wood chips, sawdust, and spruce needles that carpet the ground. Soon though, she abandons the rag and scampers away. I think, well, where was she taking that whole T-shirt anyway, and, no wonder she can't do it.

I am curious when she leaves the woodpile area. I wander out to investigate this rag to see just how snagged it is that the squirrel could not claim it for her nest. I cross the yard, pick up the rag which was not caught in the log or twigs at all. (It is the remains of my youngest son's muscle shirt from Florida fifteen years ago. The pink and turquoise beach scene gives backdrop to palm trees in silhouette.)

I smile and feel a little sheepish when I realize the squirrel has been knawing off tiny pieces of the rag and carrying them away. Many holes give evidence to this fact (the letters O and I are missing from Florida), and to the fact that the squirrel has been laboring for a long time. (Later I watch as she returns to the rag many times.)

I go back to the house with my newly-gained squirrel wisdom—one little piece at a time. When I think of writing, I want the whole piece at a time—like right-now-time. How willing am I to knaw, squirm, tumble, yank, and then summersault backwards to accomplish my goal? How many times will I attack the same material to glean out the pieces? Not often enough, even though I know that is the rule of the writing game.

Maybe I will squirrel away a few more ideas in my cookie can, and knaw and tug at them over the winter. Or perhaps I will just bake cookies.

The fact about October

The meaning behind October's name is far from accurate these days. The ancient Roman calendar was based on the lunar cycles, as opposed to our current calendar which is based on the solar cycles. This meant that there were originally 10 months in their calendar, and October was the eighth month. Its name literally translated into "the eighth month" in Latin. In 451 BC the two months of lanurarius and Februarius were added to the beginning of the calendar, making October the 10th month.

Test smoke alarms every month and replace the batteries as needed.



Voyent Alerc' is a multi-purpose communication service provided by the Municipality of Haines Junction to keep you informed of retucal events like fires or floods as well as day-to-day communications such as road maintenance and closures, water advisories, etc.







WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT

	PRINCHAUSED COMMUNICATIONS	Voyent Alertt provides informative communications. Critical information such as the distance and direction from an incident, and preferred evacuation routes from your followed locations may be provided.
	POLLOW HILLIEUS LOCATIONS	Voyent Alert! allows you to create and follow multiple locations such as 'Kids School' or "Mom's House". Any event or communication related to your followed locations will be forwarded to you along your preferred communication channel.
	COMMUNICATIONS YOUR WAY	Receive alerts over a wide variety of communication channels including mobile apps, text/SMS alerting, email or voice dial. You can register for one or more communication channels.
	NO HEREAGE PATROLE	Smart alerting capabilities ensure that you will only get notified when a communication is relevant to your or one of the locations you are following.
	CASY	Registration for the service is FREE, simple and anonymous.
