**FACTS TO CONSIDER REGARDING THE DECISIONS MADE FOR
LTF AT THE MACINTOSH PIT**

1. It is part of the YESAB format that over 70 people need to be consulted on a project that would affect them, and we have 80 people in this community. No consultation was done with the Nygren Group.
2. Why does Castle Rock Enterprises (CRE) have 30 days to respond to YESAB points, but the public only have 3 days to respond to their requests?
3. Why was the local YESAB person taken off the case when there was a decision to be made? They had done all the leg work yet could not make their recommendations on this project.
4. Our petition was dismissed because it was online, so names and signatures were not in ink, yet when Save The Peel was brought forward, names on that Petition from around the world were accepted online.
5. This is an industrial LTF project, so it should have gone through the Executive YESAB Committee, not the local office.
6. The Project was given the green light by YG Liberal Government PRIOR to public knowledge of the proponent's proposal that had already gone to YESAB for review. The Nygren Group and Haines Junction citizens should have been consulted prior to this Project going to YESAB by the Liberal Government.
7. YESAB's recommendations were based on the LTF Project Proposal being mainly for the Parks Farm remediation, when in reality, the entire Western Yukon will be targeted for land treatment, meaning much more transporting of contaminated material will be brought to the Mackintosh Gravel Pit for treatment from Beaver Creek to Mendenhall and south to Blanchard Camp.

Information provided about the number of cubic meters that will be transported:

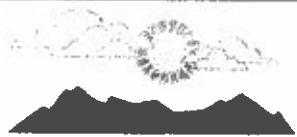
15,000 cubic meters – 10 cubic meters per dump truck x 2 (as what goes in to dump also drives out) is 3000 dump trucks over a 4-6 month period.

- The entryway is on a curve in the highway and is where the school bus turns around to head back to the school.
- No thought has been given to what this extra amount of traffic may do to this area or the danger to the school bus route.
- 3000 dump trucks – what will this do to property value??
- Environmental risk as no covers were on any dump trucks when CRE was doing the cleanup for North of 60 in Haines Junction, maybe they weren't required? Will they be using them for their LTF?

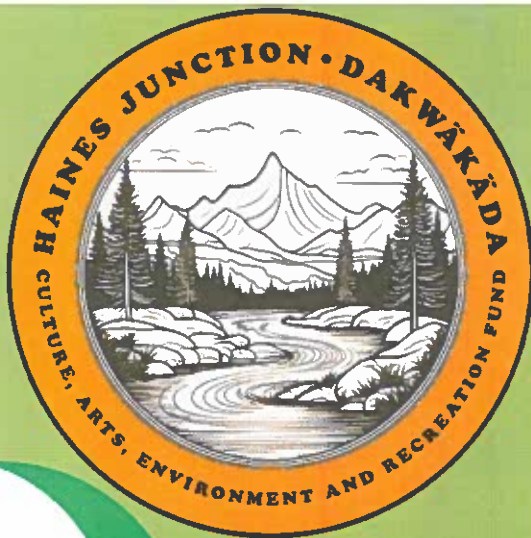
8. No baseline tests have been done on wells in the area or waterways by the Liberal Government. How will they know if this is working with no baseline to compare to?
9. YG Liberal Government's Public Engagement Our Promise document excerpts:
"Our Promise to You" To explain our decision... to foster and respect relationships with citizens ... to consider local solutions to the problems Our public engagement strategy is to serve the public...

The decision to put an LTF at the MacIntosh pit did not follow any of these promises written by the Liberal Government. No public consultation was carried out, and the public was informed of the decision after it had been made. No respect was given to anyone who offered different solutions or opinions on the health and environmental risks. People who did speak out were threatened that their funding would be cut, their job would be in jeopardy, or their business would be in jeopardy. No promise was kept.

10. Haines Junction Energy, Mines, and Resources (EMR) Branch was asked to do a Site Inspection of the LTF proposal AFTER the YG Liberal Government had already given Castle Rock Enterprise the green light to proceed with the LTF Project. After inspection of the first proposed LTF site in the Mackintosh Gravel Pit, EMR's recommendation was that it is "unacceptable due to the site bordering a resident's property". CRE then changed their location to a new site within the Mackintosh Gravel Pit and EMR did another inspection. EMR deemed the second (current) site inappropriate as well. The EMR report is available on line, and it currently suggests that this LTF Project should NOT proceed at the present location.

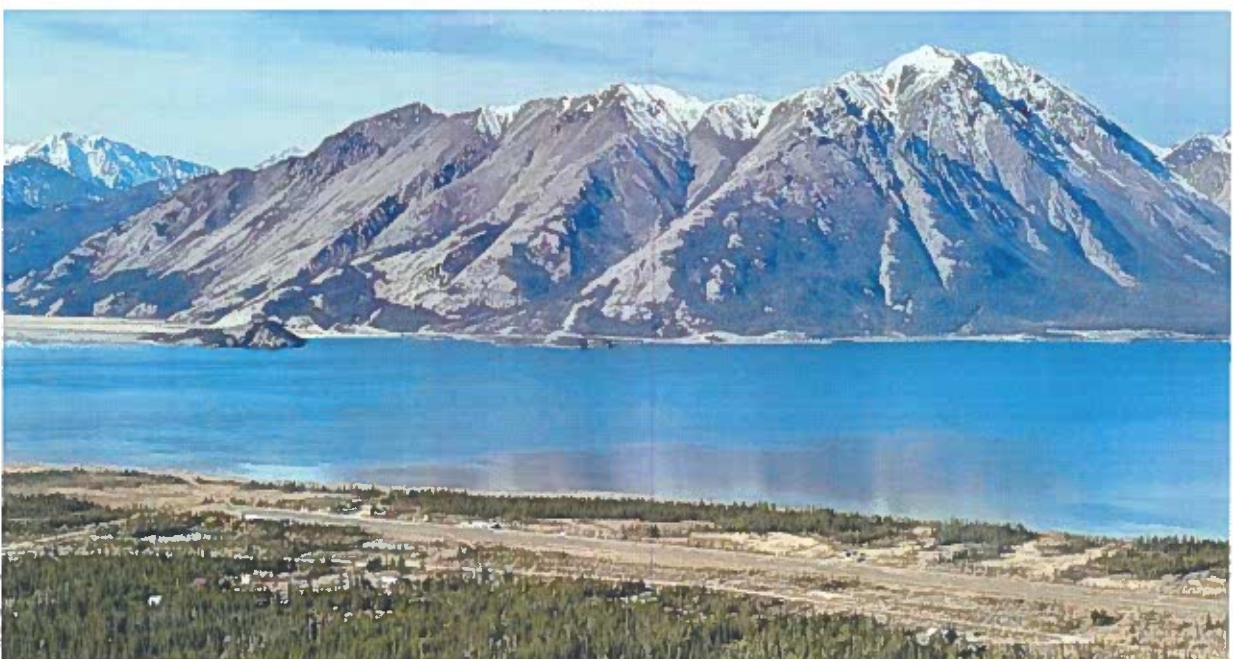
Kluane Lake Research Station - 2025 Season Summary

The Kluane Lake Research Station (KLRS) wrapped up the 2025 summer season at the beginning of October. Thank you to all the visitors and staff for a great 5 months! Guests included researchers, students, teachers, Yukon and BC First Nations, government scientists, artists, and community members. The station hosted 1469 overnight users and 100 daytrip users, facilitating over 480 different guests from 51 groups. Additionally, approximately 140 community members visited KLRS during our Community BBQ in May, Open House in September, and weekly community nights throughout the summer. The KLRS staff team consisted of five full-time staff, all of which are Yukoners.

Outreach and education were a continued priority in 2025. Weekly community nights included talks from researchers and local Indigenous artists, interpreters, and storytellers. The station welcomed primary and secondary schools from the Yukon (Haines Junction, Destruction Bay, Whitehorse), Calgary, and Mississauga. The Station Manager and visiting researchers led presentations and hands-on activities to teach students about natural sciences. Two artists were hosted at KLRS for the Kluane National Park Artist Residency, in partnership with Parks Canada and the Yukon Arts Centre. Each artist had a two-week residency and held multiple public art workshops.

Groups from twelve Canadian universities and five international universities visited KLRS in 2025 for research or field courses. Throughout May to September, long-term studies were continued, and new research was conducted. Topics included glacier dynamics, hydro-glaciology, surficial geology dating, earthquake-induced landslides, wind erosion, boreal forest ecology, subarctic phenology, vegetation mapping, climatology, upper atmosphere astronomy, and hydroponics.

Ag1054 Project

The Ag1054 project “Off-Grid Containerized Agriculture in the North” is an Arctic Institute of North America (AINA) research project based at the Kluane Lake Research Station (KLRS). Ag1054 uses a shipping container, formerly known as a Cropbox, as a controlled environment for hydroponic food production (plants grown in nutrient-enriched water instead of soil). The system is off grid, powered by solar energy with diesel backup. The unit can grow over 1000 individual plants at a time, providing crops like leafy greens and herbs. The project also includes a microgreen growing unit, greenhouse, and open field garden boxes. The Ag 1054 project team consists of Dr. Craig Gerlach (Principal Investigator), Shahid Islaam (Agriculture Research Coordinator), and Pauly Sias and Jady Hurlburt (Agriculture Advisors).

The hydroponic unit was operated from June to early October 2025, with seedlings started in May. The unit produced thousands of plants over the season (3300 lettuce, 350 cilantro, and 250 basil). The greenhouse and outdoor garden beds provided hundreds of plants, including radish (500), kale (96), broccoli (40), tomato (35) and cucumber (20). For microgreens, 120 trays of pea shoots, arugula, radish, mustard, and broccoli were grown.

The Ag1054 project is committed to community engagement and outreach; people are always welcome to visit KLRS and see the system. Harvested plants were donated to local communities throughout the season and used in the KLRS kitchen. Education is a priority for the project, including teaching local schools about hydroponics and developing a short course requested by the Taku River Tlingit First Nation. The Ag1054 team is collaborating with Kluane First Nation (KFN) and Champagne and Aishihik First Nations (CAFN) to focus on growing additional plants in the hydroponics unit that the Nations are interested in.
