## Report to Council Village of Haines Junction January 25, 2023

### **RE:** TAX LIEN SUMMARY

#### Recommendation

That Council accept this report and attached tax lien summary for information.

## **Background**

The Yukon Assessment and Taxation Act is the principal legal statute governing property taxation and assessment of fee-simple land in the Yukon. The Act delegates authority to municipalities to levy and collect taxes on lands within municipal boundaries and to apply the tax lien process against titled lands within their municipality for which property tax payments are in arrears. The property taxation year is a calendar year and property taxes are due and payable no later than July 2<sup>nd</sup> of the year in which they are levied. Fee-simple properties for which taxes remain unpaid 6 months after this due date become subject to management under the tax lien process, which provides a means for tax authorities to collect unpaid taxes.

The preparation of Form TL1 Tax Lien Summary is the first activity required in the process. The list is prepared annually by the Treasurer and a copy is forwarded to the Collector (Council) for information. This will be followed by the publication of the list in a Yukon newspaper and local postings which are used to notify fee-simple property owners that a tax lien will be filed against their property unless the arrears are paid within 60 days from the date of publication.

## **Conclusion**

Council by reviewing this report will be exercising their oversight role as the taxing authority of the municipality.

# January is time to quit smoking

Quitting smoking is not easy and it doesn't happen overnight. People who quit smoking may try different methods such as changing their diet, reducing the amount they smoke or drink, or exercising more. It's important to remember that quitting smoking is a process and it might take multiple tries before it becomes permanent.

If you want to quit smoking, it's helpful to seek help from smoking cessation programs. You can call 1 (866) 221-8393 QUITPATH for free nicotine replacement options such as patches, lozenges, gum or inhalers, or 1-877-513-5333 Smokers Helpline for help. You can also call 634-4444 to make an appointment to talk to a nurse about the Quitpath program. There are many reasons and ways to quit smoking. But you must want to quit.

It might be helpful to get involved with a smoking cessation program. You can call 1 (866) 221-8393 QUITPATH or 1-877-513-5333 Smokers Helpline for help. The Quitpath program provides a free nicotine replacement program, including patches, lozenges, gum, or inhalers. Call 634-4444 to book an appointment to speak to a nurse about Quitpath today.






## **Project Scope - Summary:**

The proposed Project is the commercial tourism operation of guided expeditions and associated activities on Mount Logan and other high mountains in Kluane National Park and Reserve. The Project is located within the Traditional Territories of Champagne and Aishihik First Nations, Kluane First Nation, and White River First Nation. The average duration of the expeditions will be four weeks between April and June, with up to three trips per season, for five years, beginning in 2023.



## **Project Scope - Activities:**

- Air transportation (fixed-wing aircraft) into the Mount Logan area from the Silver City Airport
- Guided mountaineering and ski-mountaineering on Mount Logan, Mount Steele and other mountains in the Kluane icefields
- In 2023, one expedition is proposed on Mount Logan with a 1:3 guide-to-client ratio
- For subsequent years, up to 3 expeditions are proposed in the icefields with a 1:4 guide-to-client ratio
- Groups of up to 8 people (including guides)
- Overnight camping including food and fuel storage and solid and human waste disposal
  - Snow used as a source of water
  - Grey water; disposed in a grey water container
  - 4 liters of fuel (benzine) per person
  - Fuel stored in a closed tin container
  - o Group will carry a binder in case a spills



## **Project Scope - Summary:**

The Project is the decommissioning of **11 and reestablishment of 2** hydrometric cableway stations throughout the Yukon due to infrastructure deficiencies and safety concerns. Activities of each site is expected to take up to 5 days between May and September. Project activities may occur over the next 5 years.

The Project is located within the Traditional Territories of the following First Nations: First Nation of Na-Cho Nyäk Dun (NND), White River First Nation (WRFN), Kluane First Nation (KFN), Champagne and Aishihik First Nations (CAFN), Teslin Tlingit Council (TTC), Kwanlin Dün First Nation (KDFN), Selkirk First Nation (SFN), Ta'an Kwäch'än Council (TKC), Liard First Nation (LFN), Ross River Dena Council (RRDC), Vuntut Gwitchin First Nation (VGFN), and Little Salmon/Carmacks First Nation (LSCFN).

Activities are proposed only on administrative reserves of Environment and Climate Change Canada. Six of the sites are located adjacent to Settlement Land Parcels of SFN (R-4B), TTC (R-1A and R15-B), NND (R-16B and R-4A), and VGFN (R-4A, R-1A, and R-10A).



## **Project Scope - Activities:**

Information in **Bold** has been amended by the Proponent.

- Access:
  - Access by road to the Ibex River site (09AC007)
    - Establishment of an excavator trail (80 m x 5 m) to access the Ibex River site
  - All other sites accessed by helicopter from the nearest city
    - Up to 2 flights/day/site
  - Minor brush clearing of aircraft access sites and access trail

- One time stream fording of a spider excavator at Ibex River site (09AC007)
- Decommissioning:
  - Use of heavy equipment
    - E10 Mini excavator for helicopter accessible sites
    - Larger excavator used for road accessible site
  - Dismantling of the towers and removal of cables and utilities
  - Excavation and removal of existing anchors approximately 2.5m in depth
  - Excavation and removal of existing A-frame footings approximately 1.5m in depth
  - Site restoration
  - All equipment and tools will be be kept clean to not introduce any foreign materials to the site
  - o Best management practices in Erosion and Sediment Control Plan will be followed
  - Sites will be revegetated with clippings taken from any removed vegetation to promote regrowth
- Re-establishment of two sites, Old Crow River near the Mouth (09FC001) & Ibex River near Whitehorse (07AC007):
  - Installation or replacement of steel plate anchors
  - Replacement of A frame towers, wood cribbing, cables and/or utilities
  - Limited excavation
- Disposal:
  - Removal of dismantled structures and foreign material
- No camp proposed
- All machinery will have spill kits available
