#### RTC 2023-06-14 2023 Roof replacement

In 2021, engineered assessments of the roofs at the Arena and Emergency Services buildings were undertaken and it was recommended that both roofs be replaced. A request for proposal (RFP) was created and publicly advertised. Two submissions were received on May 25th, 2023. The tenders were opened on June 1st. The bid value from the low bidder (AFAB) was \$270,000.00 plus G.S.T. The bid value from the high bidder was \$433,048.98 plus G.S.T. The high bid was noncompliant due to missing information on the proposed start and completion dates. The high bidders bid bond has been returned.

The existing project budget of \$200,000 would need to be expanded to cover the cost of the roof replacement. Additional funds should be set aside to address contingencies and the possible need for the addition of heat trace lines to the Emergency Center roof drains.
