Deputy Mayor Strand - Attended the Association of Yukon Communities AGM.

AYC AGM - Once again a good presentation done by Tosh Southwick and Davida Wood from Inspire Reconciliation Potential (IRP). There was a noticeable difference between their presentation and how people responded last year and this year. Made me think that there is more movement towards Reconciliation.

Also a very interesting presentation with the Village of Teslin, the Teslin Tlingit Council and Council of Yukon First Nations on how they work together. The CYFN Grand Chief, Peter Johnston, and AYC President, Ted Laking, are in discussion on working towards something similar as Yukon forum and gather all Mayors and Chiefs in Yukon at a gathering to be called "Mayor and Chief Gathering". The first one may be in October of 2023.

Christina Benty, Strategic Leadership Solutions, did about 4 workshops. It was really good. Brought back three booklets that she had developed specifically for Yukon Municipalities and are here for Council to look at.

There were a few resolutions that were put into place. There is a request for a comprehensive joint Municipal Act review. It was suggested that we look into the British Columbia Community Charter for reference as some content may be fitting for Yukon. Two other municipalities brought up that their First Nations can not vote; There is an avenue that the Municipal Act will be open and could be revised accordingly.

There were requests for the Canada Community Building fund allocation to be tripled throughout the Yukon, for a disaster assistance fund, and better coverage for the Emergency Medical Services. They have also passed a motion on meaningful and respectful consultation with municipal governments

The Putting People First presentation will happen at the next board meeting as Health and Social Services Minister Tracy-Anne McPhee was not able to attend the AGM. AYC asked if we would be putting a motion or discussion at a future AGM. There was an incredible annual report and Yukon Aging Report presented. They gave us a bunch of Naloxone kits. I distributed some and have more to leave at the office.

It was a very informative annual general meeting.
