The discussion will be on the debris from Area 1 clearing that has been filling up the landfill; and keeping Council advised on the development progress and next steps before they happen and not after. There will also be discussion on the lots for lottery on Bates Street. There are concerns on their current state of which the Village of Haines Junction holds no responsibility.

Councillor Nassiopoulos requested to ask if the lots on Bates St. have been compacted and what happens if they start to move; and about the concerns on the proximity and shape of lots in Area 1.

Council will request a map of what is going to be built on Area 1 in the next year to show the public.

Deputy CAO Istchenko shared the following updates with Council:

- Water Automation Upgrade is complete
- SCADA has progressed to point that we are no longer at risk. Options are being submitted by contractors for the next steps.
- Patching of the Pine Lake Trail, basketball court, and Convention Center parking will commence as soon as patching equipment is received.
- Street sweeping will begin as soon as the street sweeper attachment is received.
- All gravel surfaces have been graded and some packed. Currently sourcing calcium to be applied for dust control.
- Pothole repair has begun on shoulders and corners with gravel material. Cold-mix patching on BST surfaces will begin as soon as the days get warmer.
- RFP for arena and Firehall roof repair is currently awaiting bids.
